# Parents' Evenings & Reporting

The school will continue to use the Parents' Evening Online Booking system to make the process of booking appointments easier for all. We would encourage parents to book appointments as early as possible as availability can get tight – which is why we have extended the S1 and S2 evenings by 30 minutes. Please make sure the school office holds the most up to date mobile number and email address for all parents/carers.

Lesmahagow High School are always looking for ways to improve communication between school and families. We have been reviewing how we employ reports on pupil progress and are piloting a new approach for session 2018-19. Instead of receiving one lengthy full report towards the end of the year, parents will receive three tracking reports throughout the year to offer more regular updates on progress. Along with the standard ratings for effort, behaviour and homework (or progress in senior phase reports), teachers will offer a succinct comment which summarises your son/daughter's progress in the subject area. More discussion about the pupil's strengths and action points will take place at parents' evenings but it is hoped that regular updates will help to ensure all young people are progressing with their learning and addressing development needs as they arise.

#### Promoting Positive Behaviour

Towards the end of session 2017-18, the Promoting Positive Behaviour working group completed surveys of pupils, parents and staff to seek views on the merit/demerit system. This feedback has been invaluable and has helped to shape some targets for the upcoming sessions. These include:

#### Improve consistency in how merits/ demerits are being issued

A common piece of feedback was that pupils felt some staff were not using merits / demerits consistently across the school – we intend to improve this by offering staff training at in-service days and creating posters which highlight the behaviours which will earn merits and demerits and which offer new guidelines on how teachers should be issuing merits (E.g. Subjects taught 1 period per week can issue 1 merit per week, subjects which teach 4 periods per week can issue a maximum of 3 merits per week).

#### Ensure all pupils feel able to earn a place on merit reward events

From August, all merit rewards will be based on individual pupil targets and not on the top merit earners in practical class. A calendar of events has been prepared for the full year which should allow pupils to know what they are working towards next and what their targets are. This will be displayed around the school.

#### Improve communication about the merit / demerit system

The working group are looking at ways to improve communication between staff and pupils (e.g. how pupils are informed when they earn a merit and opportunities to get merit totals) and between the school and families.

# Foundation Apprenticeships


We were delighted to welcome the first Foundation Apprenticeship students to the Lesmahagow Hub on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> August. Pupils from across South Lanarkshire Council will be working over the next two years to gain a Foundation Apprenticeship in the 'Children and Young People' framework. Lecturers from New College Lanarkshire are delivering the course, which has a work placement element, in conjunction with South Lanarkshire Council. Over the summer work has been taking place to transform one of the classrooms into a dynamic learning environment combining a 'nursery' with a traditional classroom, which will help pupils learn the practical and academic skills required for employment in this sector.

In addition to the five pupils from Lesmahagow High who will be attending the Lesmahagow Hub, a further four pupils are completing Foundation Apprenticeships in a variety of courses, such as Scientific Technologies, Engineering Systems, Business Skills and ICT Software at Glasgow Kelvin College and EKGTA training centre in East Kilbride. We also have one S6 pupil who is entering year 2 of the Creative and Digital Media course, where there is a greater emphasis on utilising the skills learned in year 1 within a workplace environment.

On successful completion of these courses, all pupils gain an industry recognised qualification at SCQF Level 6 (SQA Higher level), which also contains component parts of a Modern Apprenticeship.

#### **Inspiring Lesmahagow**

The "Inspiring Lesmahagow" initiative is moving into its second year and the school are delighted with the progress made so far. The initiative came about because the Scottish Government gave additional money to schools to offer targeted support to young people in order to raise attainment and achievement. Throughout 2017-18, four coordinators (Mrs Robison, Mrs Rae, Mrs Smith and Miss Ballantyne) worked together to offer a varied and interesting programme of activities for the 65 pupils who formed the group. Highlights included the cinema trip to see "Wonder", which the pupils had read and received copies of the book, the Science Centre excursion, the Family Café which was organised by pupils, and the successful Friday afternoon workshops which focused on literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing skills. The year was rounded off by the residential trip to Aberfoyle where pupils experienced activities including archery and problem solving challenges.

This year, the targeted group has increased to 103 pupils and some of the staff involved have changed. The team is now:

The final plans are being prepared for session 2018-19 and we look forward to unveiling the full programme shortly. Activities already in the works include a land art project with the local community and the Helen's Letters workshops where pupils will be writing to famous people who inspire them.
